



OVERVIEW

SCAD Study Abroad and the School of Fashion are pleased to announce *Bridging the Gap: Creative Process and Mass Production*. This winter-break excursion invites students to gain a global perspective on all aspects of jewelry, from creative design thinking, to resourcing and manufacturing processes. Students will travel to Hong Kong and mainland China to meet with leading industry professionals by visiting design houses, manufacturing facilities and research labs. The field-based research component of this program may serve as a critical stepping stone to future achievements in the students' academic and professional growth. This excursion offers students the opportunity to develop their individual creativity and technical skills in jewelry design and studio art in the multi-faceted, culturally stimulating, creative environment of Hong Kong.

COURSES

SELECTION CRITERIA

For consideration for SCAD study abroad programs, students must be in good standing with the university. Class standing, GPA and seat availability in courses are also factors for acceptance. In addition to submitting a completed application, students must have their course selections approved by their student success adviser or graduate adviser via an advising confirmation form. Students will be prompted by the application system to upload this form. Students interested in applying should schedule an appointment with their adviser prior to completing the application. VISA

The length of the program requires students to be in Hong Kong for 21 days. Please check your 'duration of stay' restrictions and requirements, as the country issuing your passport may limit your duration of stay in Hong Kong. Please note that some non-US passport holders may be ineligible for this program due to timeline and visa restrictions. All students are required to have a visa to enter People's Republic of China for the visit to Guangzhou. The study abroad office will work with students to secure this visa. This cost is included in the program fee.



HOUSING + DINING

Students will reside at the Gold Coast Residences in Hong Kong. Participants may request up to 2 roommates of the same gender. SCAD study abroad can not guarantee all roommate preferences can be accommodated.

Some meals will be included in the program fee, however, students will be responsible for some of their meals. The apartments at the Gold Coast Residences have a fully equipped kitchen. Students can prepare meals or dine out.

TRAVEL

Each program participant will arrange his or her own flight to and from Hong Kong. Students should plan to book travel after official acceptance into the program. Students will travel to mainland China by bus. The bus transport is included in the program fee. Early check in can not be accommodated.
