



## OVERVIEW

The office of study abroad, with the School of Entertainment Arts, is pleased to offer *Hong Kong Film Initiative*. Students will collaborate with peers through all stages of film production, from pre-production, production design, location scouting, actor rehearsals and filming, to create a Hong Kong based film. Using the city of Hong Kong as the set, the group will produce a movie within the three week period in Hong Kong. This will be an exciting collaboration between performing arts, film and television, production design, sound design and themed entertainment design. Students will have the opportunity to be cast as an actor for this project or work as part of the production team to create a film with fellow students in the stunning city of Hong Kong.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

For consideration for SCAD study abroad programs, students must be in good standing with the university. Class standing, GPA and seat availability in courses are also factors for acceptance. In addition to submitting a completed application, students must have their course selections approved by their student success adviser or graduate adviser via an advising confirmation form. Students will be prompted by the application system to upload this form. Students interested in applying should schedule an appointment with their adviser prior to completing the application. Applications can be accessed in MySCAD > Student Workspace tab > Study Abroad Channel.

Final approval will be granted by the department chair.

## VISA

The length of the program requires students to be in Hong Kong for 21 days. Please check your 'duration of stay' restrictions and requirements, as the country issuing your passport may limit your duration of stay in Hong Kong. Please note that some non-US passport holders may be ineligible for this program due to timeline and visa restrictions.
